A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AND FAMILY DEVELOPMENT TO APPLY FOR, AND ACCEPT, THE 2013 TIER II BOATING INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDS FROM THE U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE, TO BUILD OR EXTEND DOCKAGE AT FOUR (4) PROMINENT LOCATIONS ALONG THE DOWNTOWN SOUTH SHORE OF THE TENNESSEE RIVER AND FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TRANSIENT, NONTRAILERABLE VESSELS AT EACH LOCATION, IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-FIVE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$1,285,868.00) AND SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$65,000.00), FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THREE HUNDRED EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$1,350,868.00).

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE, That the Director of the Department of Youth and Family Development is hereby authorized to apply for, and accept, the 2013 Tier II Boating Infrastructure Grant Program funds from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, to build or extend dockage at four (4) prominent locations along the downtown south shore of the Tennessee River and for the installation of transient, nontrailerable vessels at each location, in the amount of \$1,285,868.00 and \$65,000.00, for a total amount of \$1,350,868.00.

**Riverfront Parkway Project**

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The City of Chattanooga's Riverfront Parkway Project BIG application seeks to meet the broad objective of enhancing the Downtown Chattanooga Riverfront, located along the southern portion of the Tennessee River (see accompanying maps), into a highly desirable transient boating destination.

To achieve this goal, the City will use the referenced grant funds to build or extend guest dockage at four prominent locations along the downtown south shore of the Tennessee River, namely the Bluff Furnace Historical Park, Ross' Landing, the Olgiati Bridge, and the Riverfront Parkway Marina. Please see accompanying maps for the proposed placement of a total of forty four (44) transient boat slips.

The City of Chattanooga maintains a consistently strong tourism industry, but is unable to allow visitors and residents to fully utilize its primary historical attraction; the Tennessee River. The currently available dockage is very limited and is located far from the high tourism shore areas:

1. Transient
  1. Bluff View Dock - publically owned; 6 horizontal tie-ups
  2. Olgiati Bridge Dock - publically owned; 4 horizontal tie-ups
2. Non-transient
  1. Marine Max - leased marina (long term leases)

The need for transient dockage has been identified through local community interest, usage rates during large regional and national riverfront events, and identification in the architectural study 'Ross' Landing Park Improvements', by Jones and Jones (March 2012).






