## I. Project Description

- 1. The City of Chattanooga is proposing multiple upgrades to its existing permanent Household Hazardous Waste facility. These upgrades were based upon recommendations issued by Special Waste Associates in their 'Report on City of Chattanooga HHW Collection Facility Visit' dated November 2014 & February 2015. These upgrades include installing gas monitoring and alarms system, ventilation, and applying chemical resistant coating to the staging area's floor. Our goals include increased participation and corresponding tonnage and a decreased amount of non-acceptable or unidentifiable materials coming into the facility. Our objectives include additional training for persons on site, adding a City position, Hazardous Waste Technician to assist with the transport and handling of materials, increased number of days open (moving from 1 day per month to 5 days per week), and increased education.
- 2. Once monies are received from the HHW Operation and Maintenance Grant for our intended upgrades, the City of Chattanooga will begin making necessary changes to its site beginning in early Spring 2016 with upgrades being completed prior to fall of 2016. The City of Chattanooga will also hire a full time Hazardous Waste Technician who will attend the facility 5 days a week.
- 3. As the City of Chattanooga already has a permanent facility these upgrades will not expand the site itself but will make the existing program safer in numerous respects both for the residents and for the contractors who collect, test, and package the hazardous materials. However, the City of Chattanooga is expanding its operations; moving from being open only one day per month to being open five days per week. The City estimates between 4,000 participants annually for the next two fiscal years increasing to 5,000 for the following three fiscal years. The facility will continue to serve all of the City of Chattanooga residents as well as all of the Hamilton County residents at no charge. The City of Chattanooga has approximately 59,000 distinct parcels with a demand of over 66,200. For the past two fiscal years, the City has averaged 929 residents attending the event.
- 4. The facility is located within the City's Wood Recycle Center located at 3925 North Hawthorne Street, Chattanooga, Tennessee 37406. The site will be open every week Tuesday through Saturday from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM.
- 5. In support of the Solid Waste Plans 2015-2015, the site's purpose is to remove hazardous wastes from the general waste stream by accepting toxic materials that are

commonly stored within general households and to reduce contamination and increase space of the area landfill.

## II. Waste Management and Diversion

- Hazardous materials will be collected by a City Hazardous Waste Technician in addition
  to the City's contractor who will test as needed, before storing in heavy duty plastic
  barrels labeled by type. Barrels are then marked by the lead chemist for shipping and
  then placed onto the contractor's truck where it is then driven to contractor's disposal
  site. City staff will not test any toxic/ hazardous material. Unidentified materials are
  not allowed.
- 2. Material types listed below as well as the tonnage. Estimated tonnage for the next five years will average 300 tons per year.

#### i. Acceptable Materials

Aluminum paint, antifreeze, cadmium/nickel batteries, calcium carbide, calcium polysulfide, corrosive lab pack alkaline, ethanol/nitrogen container, oil based paints, fire extinguishers, flammable (bulk), flammable (liquid), flammable (solid), flammable (solvent), Freon cylinders, helium cylinders, isocyanates, lab pack acid & acid compatibles, lab pack basic & basic compatibles for incineration, lab pack flammable, lab pack for mercury, lab pack for organics, lab pack for oxidizers, lab pack reactive flammables, lithium batteries, mercury, mixed batteries, motor oil, nitrous oxide, oxygen cylinders, part B nitrogen cylinder, PCB light ballast, poisonous material, propane tank, putty & adhesives, RCRA exempt consolidated solvent, RCRA exempt mixed aerosols, RCRA exempt pesticide liquids, solid pesticide lab pack, straight fluorescent tubes over 4 ft, and trichloroisocyan.

3. All contractor staff are required to meet and maintain specific training guidelines. A contingency plan is attached. The City of Chattanooga's Recycling Coordinator who frequently oversees collection has a SWANA certification in Household Hazardous Waste

- concerning Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generators. The City's Hazardous Waste Technician will complete all required training by the State of Tennessee.
- 4. The City of Chattanooga has utilized a reuse program for materials such as pesticides, insecticides, fungicides, and applicable cleaners to be used by City personnel at its Wood Recycle Center. The City does not have an estimated cost of savings for reuse material at this time.
- 5. The City began its contract with Environmental Enterprises, Inc in 2012. The contract is a 12 month blanket contract and may be renewed for 4 additional years. Contract is attached detailing service costs. In 2017, the City of Chattanooga will begin its process of establishing a new contract in its bidding process.

## III. Education Plan

- The City of Chattanooga promotes its household hazardous waste facility and collection
  days via its webpage, brochures, and Facebook page with the goal of bringing awareness
  of the program itself, the acceptable materials, and the purpose of collection, namely
  removing harmfully chemicals/substances from the general waste stream and therefore
  the City's landfill.
- 2. The City of Chattanooga's Recycling Coordinator educates the public at special events and through the City's Facebook page the benefits of not placing household hazardous waste in their garbage cans as well as the broad range of acceptable materials the City collects. The target audience is both residents of the City of Chattanooga and those living in Hamilton County as the site allows each to bring their materials to be safely disposed of in an environmentally safe manner at no cost. Currently, Facebook posts are sent out monthly to twice a month notifying the site followers what the City's household hazardous waste collection entails.
- 3. Per the City of Chattanooga's Integrated Waste Management Plan:

## **GOALS**

- To decrease the total amount of solid waste material generated in the waste stream while ensuring the protection of human health and natural resources.
- ii. To increase tonnage of recyclable materials generated through automated curbside collection, recycle convenience centers, and household hazardous waste facility.
- iii. To be in accordance with federal, state, and local laws.
- 4. The City of Chattanooga will enlist the service of its coordinator, manager, and directors on an as needed basis pertaining to education of its household hazardous waste facility.

#### IV. Project Sustainability

Under the new guidelines set forth by the State of Tennessee, the City of Chattanooga
will be classified as a Tier I Facility as listed in the State of Tennessee's Department of
Environment and Conservation's Household Hazardous Waste Facility Operations and
Maintenance Grant Program Application Manual for Fiscal Year 2015-2016. The City will

- review approximately \$100,000.00 as the new reimbursement amount. Any costs that arise over the limit will be covered within the Public Works annual budget. Salaries would be approximately \$45,000.00 with supplies being \$500.00 annually; remainder will be put towards the professional fee, namely the contractor costs which make up the highest percentage of the annual cost. Quotes and specifications sheets for proposed improvements are attached.
- 2. The City of Chattanooga's bid process selects the lowest bidder ensuring that prospective savings are met at the start of the contract. Wastes taken to the City's household hazardous waste facility are removed from the waste stream and summarily save taxpayer money by removing associated transfer station and landfill costs. The City instructed the contractor to keep materials on site, safely stored within the confines of the facility, until the associated drums are full, saving the costs related to packing and transport. The contractor has a set mobilization fee which incorporates set up and personnel.
- 3. Supplementary costs not covered by a State grant or reimbursement will be covered within the Public Works annual budget which is derived solely from property taxes.
- 4. The City of Chattanooga will create a capital improvement fund for the upcoming fiscal budget year for materials purchased through the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation grant program as well as a maintenance plan to ensure that the received materials have a normal to extended life without unnecessary wear and tear.
- 5. Site improvements will be inspected by both the Sanitation Manager and Recycling Coordinator once they have been summarily completed. Inspection will include reviewing the newly established maintenance plan and evaluating the efficiency and utilization of acquired materials. Random audits of the contracting crew will be performed by both the Sanitation Manager and Recycling Coordinator.
