East Lake Park: Lake Restoration Program and Water Quality Improvements

Scope:

The proposed scope of work for Water Quality Improvements at East Lake Park would consist of a two-phase approach detailing the planning, design, construction, and water quality educational and community outreach aspects of the project.

Phase I of the proposal would include conducting an ecological assessment and identifying appropriate measures for lake restoration and remediation management. The assessment would determine the best approach for: 1) silt removal, 2) plant and fish management, 3) lake shore line stabilization and enhancement, 4) analyzing inflow and outflow conditions, and developing a restoration plan and cost schedule for construction and lake rehabilitation management. The restoration plan shall also include long-term plant and fish management. The restoration plan shall include a design/engineering plan for lake shore line enhancement for structures that can be incorporated to enhance lake features for water quality educational purposes.

The additional components to Phase I consist of developing a concept and preliminary design for Best Management Practices (BMP) with Green Infrastructures (GI) at various locations around the lake to reduce the inflow of sedimentation into the lake.

One of the most important aspects of this proposal is developing an educational opportunity at East Lake Park by partnering with local schools and neighborhood groups.

Phase II will include construction and implementation of project elements (Lake Restoration, Green Infrastructure improvements and Water Quality Education) proposed in phase I.

 - a. Sediment removal/construction management
 - b. Plant and fish removal/management
 - c. Shoreline stabilization
- 2. Final Design and Construction
 - a. Sediment control and Green infrastructure improvement
 - b. Install educational components
