# Councilman Pierce made the motion to move Resolution (j) forward on the agenda; Councilman Shockley seconded the motion; the motion carried.

Councilman Pierce stated that Sgt. Carter asked him about the change of the right-of-way name of Carter Street to Reggie White Boulevard and after that several became involved to make this a reality. He stated before he gets too involved in making comments, he wanted to openly thank members of the Public Works Department who assisted with this and named Jackson Bennett, Debie Mikel, Angela Patton, Ben Taylor, Jeff Gilbert, Curtis Busby and Ken Doyle. Later in the meeting he realized he unintentionally failed to thank one other person and openly acknowledged Steve Leach's assistance in moving this forward. He expressed deep appreciation to all for their efforts.

He stated Carter Street was symbolically named as a tribute to Reggie White but now it will officially be known as Reggie White Boulevard. He stated that he learned two weeks ago that the matter would be on the agenda next week and was glad to see it coming up, however, he got to thinking how symbolic it would be if it were put on the agenda tonight with the significance of what is going on today. He stated he does not know who will be elected as the next President, but regardless whether it is Democrat of Republican history will be made to know on this day we sought to change the street name to honor Reggie White! He stated he will always say Reggie represented this city well and as a result, he asked Reggie's Coach, Lurone Jennings, to say a couple words, as well as Sgt. Carter.

**Coach Lurone Jennings** thanked Councilman Pierce and the Council and invoked God's blessings upon each of them for the work they do for the city as a whole. He stated he was not only Reggie's former Coach but a personal friend and again thanked the Council for recognizing and honoring him as he represented the city well; that this is a grand honor and privilege. He stated Reggie's mother has been in the hospital and was released today and could not attend, which is why no family is present; however, they are really excited about this happening and are very grateful. He thanked God for Sgt. Carter for spearheading this and the Committee.

At this point Councilman Pierce presented the street sign to Coach Jennings to pass on to the family expressing hope that within the next couple weeks there will be a change of signs on Carter Street. He stated he would work that out with Public Works and the Committee and family members could meet on the site and officially place the sign in display.

**Sgt. Carter** thanked everyone for their service to the city, noting that he has been with the department twenty years, explaining that police officers do other things in the community. He stated he has been coaching at Howard for the last twelve years, again stating police officers do other things in the community. He stated he and Coach Tarver wanted to so something at Howard that would leave a legacy; that Reggie was a good man and was a spokesman for the city. He stated changing the street sign will actually benefit more than people know, especially when the Division 1 Championship Game comes in December – everyone will walk, drive and pass by Reggie White Boulevard and know he was from Chattanooga! He concluded his comments by expressing thanks to all.

Councilman Pierce recognized other members of the Committee who were present – Herman Prater, Sr., Mae Adams and Coach Alvin Tarver.

Vice Chairman Benson expressed appreciation to everyone for what they have done for Reggie, noting that he was a good role model; that the good he did for everyone goes back to them!

## SINGLE SOURCE PURCHASE INQUIRY

Councilwoman Gaines inquired as to the single source purchase with Komatsu, noticing that there were five bids but it was a single source purchase. She asked if it is common to receive five bids if the purchase falls within TCA 6-56-304.2.

Dan Johnson responded that five bids were sent out and only one was received; that districts for power equipment have a franchise in this area.

Councilwoman Gaines stated that she understands that and continued to question the necessity to send out five bids when using a single source supplier.

## SINGLE SOURCE PURCHASE INQUIRY (Continued)

Mr. Johnson stated five bids were sent out to the distributors for Komatsu/Dresser equipment to various districts and as he understands it only one replied; that sometimes they try to get competition but some will not do it.

Councilwoman Gaines stated when TCA 6-56-304.6 "goes" with a company why the need to send out bids.

Mr. Johnson expressed that he understood, noting there was not a need to send out to five bidders.

# <u>Fire hat</u>

Councilwoman Berz directed attention to the fire hat on the dais in front of her, noting that it was presented to her by the Fire Department for helping with a project for which she takes absolutely no credit. She stated the Department is to be commended for a project in her area in conjunction with the Red Cross in delivering smoke detectors.

Asst. Chief Parker stated that the smoke detectors were donated by the Board of Realtors, who came out to help install them. He stated there was a great turnout of about 70 people, which is the largest turnout ever. He stated the only thing they need to work on is the start time that may need to be "bumped back"; that they started at 8:30 a.m. and woke some people up! He stated it was a good day, great weather and expressed appreciation to Councilwoman Berz for coming out and walking with them.

Councilwoman Robinson expressed thanks to the Fire Department and Councilwoman Berz!

## COUNCILMAN SHOCKLEY

Mention was made that this was Councilman Shockley's last evening with the Council; however, clarification was given that it was not.

Councilwoman Robinson stated if it is his last night she wanted to report that it has been a pleasure to sit next to him these past few months and that he has served the city well. She stated she wanted to be the first to say it has been a pleasure to work with him.

Vice Chairman Benson stated if there is ever a need for a replacement the Council will not have to interview him (Shockley)!

Councilman Pierce stated it would be at least a couple weeks before the vote is verified and Councilman Shockley's vacation is not quite ready to start.

City Attorney Nelson stated Councilman Shockley represents District 5 and is doing a fine job. He stated as it relates to his replacement, that will be voted upon today and he does not know when plans are for the Election Commission to meet to certify the winners. He stated if they meet before next Tuesday, then we bid Mr. Shockley a fond farewell; if not, he will be called upon to continue for another week.

Councilman Pierce asked the City Attorney if he has ever known the Election Commission to meet that soon to verify.

City Attorney Nelson responded that there has been a time or two.

Vice Chairman Benson acknowledged that he has enjoyed serving with Mr. Shockley.

Councilman Page stated that he has enjoyed with him in case it is his last night, but expressed his thought that he would be "on board" awhile.

Councilwoman Berz stated from experience he would be on the Council another two weeks. She stated she has enjoyed every minute of his being on the Council and that he is doing a great job!

He stated during the discussion of the PILOT agreement and abatement of taxes, Daisy Madison was asked to look at what the city is doing in terms of educational programs for youth; that the focus of the discussion was to give companies that come before us for abatement of taxes an opportunity to invest in young people in our community by the various educational programs we do through the Arts and Culture Department and our Recreation Department. He stated we do have after-school programs, tutoring and a lot going on like that to consider, giving companies that come before us an opportunity to help with the focus on our youth and the future of our city in those endeavors.

Vice Chairman Benson stated that the city does spend quite a bit on education and if the PILOT program is helping the county we need to see how much we are spending. He expressed thanks to Councilman Page for his creativity in thinking this through.

City Attorney Nelson stated as part of the Public Works Committee next week, one of the topics will be the EPB cable franchise and there may be interested people who want to be present.
