COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 3, 2015 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Dr. Carol Berz and Councilpersons Chris Anderson, Moses Freeman, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. Also present were Deputy City Attorney Phil Noblett and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Grohn led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

APPROVAL OF LAST MINUTES

On motion of Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Freeman, the minutes of the last meeting (February 24, 2015) were approved as published.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Proclamation: "Luther Masingill Day"
Presented by Councilman Chris Anderson

Councilman Anderson recognized the late Luther Masingill, a National Radio Hall of Fame inductee, for his career in radio and television that spanned more than 73 years. He also recognized three (3) of Luther's family members in the Assembly: wife, Mary Masingill; daughter, Joan Masingill Brown; and son, Jeffrey Masingill. Mrs. Masingill and Mrs. Brown expressed thanks to the city. News anchor David Carroll exhorted the city to "act like Luther" on March 9—"Luther Masingill Day"—by doing random acts of kindness.

Councilman Anderson made the following proclamation on behalf of the City of Chattanooga:

Whereas

Luther Masingill, a legend in Chattanooga as the longest running broadcaster in history on both radio and TV, passed away on October 20, 2014 at the age of 92 after more than 73 years as morning host of WDEF Radio and 60 years on WDEF Channel 12;

Whereas Luther served his country with honor in military service during World War II, a

patriot who loved not only his country, but his city of birth, Chattanooga, where he also with passion and commitment served his fellow Tennesseans by giving of his

time and talents wherever needed;

Whereas Luther believed in the power of "random acts of kindness" as recounted through

numerous personal testimonies of how Luther reached out by extending a personal helping hand or actively supporting local charities that provided needed assistance;

Whereas Luther not only loved his fellow man, but was dog's "best friend" by using his radio

program to reunite pet owners with their beloved furry friends;

Whereas Luther will always be remembered for setting the example by his own time and

resources of the true meaning of "love one another".

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved

that the day of March 9, Luther's birthday in 1922, be observed as "Luther Day" to encourage Chattanooga residents to reach out to others through random acts of kindness in memory of Luther Masingill.
