

City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES August 25, 2015 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Carol Berz called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Moses Freeman and Council members Chris Anderson, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Chip Henderson, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present. Councilman Yusuf Hakeem was not present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Smith led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. He invited Pastor Paul Longmire of Hixson United Methodist Church to give the invocation.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 24, DIVISION 9, SECTIONS 24-388, 24-389, 24-390, AND 24-390.1, RELATIVE TO PERMITS FOR VALET PARKING IN METERED SPACES FOR DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES.

Councilman Anderson called a *Point of Order*, stating that this ordinance should apply citywide, not just downtown. Attorney Hinton concurred and agreed to make the change in wording. With the change in wording, **Councilman Anderson moved to approve**, seconded by Councilman Gilbert.

Blythe Bailey, Transportation Administrator, responded to questions about the specification of a start time for valet services. Councilman Henderson offered to make a motion. Councilman

Anderson objected, due a motion already being on the floor. Once recognized by the Chair, Councilman Anderson and his seconder withdrew their motion. **Councilman Henderson moved** to defer one (1) week, seconded by Councilman Anderson. The motion carried.
