
The purpose of the friends of the North River Civic Center is to act as an advisory panel to support the center in promotion, programs, publicity, volunteer staffing and fund raising.





SWEET GEORGIA SOUND

In existence since 1994, Sweet Georgia Sound is a 20-member ensemble which provides Big Band Swing and dance music for weddings, parties, festivals, galas and other events. SGS is regularly featured at the Chattanooga Market, has made appearances at Chattanooga's Riverbend Festival and was the founding band and coproducer of Chattanooga's Swingfest. Most recently SGS was chosen to be the featured performer at the centennial celebration for the Hamilton County Courthouse.

SGS plays a variety of listening, dance and ballroom dance music that includes classic and modern big band, swing, Latin, and waltz tunes and features the vocal numbers of some of the greats like Frank Sinatra and Ella Fitzgerald. Sweet Georgia Sound is proud to be known as Chattanooga's Big Band.



JERICO BRASS BAND

The Jericho Brass, a traditional British-style brass band, has been providing brass music in Chattanooga and surrounding communities since 1998. An all-volunteer ensemble, Jericho Brass is made up of professional and college trained musicians from the Tri-State area. The group performs regularly at civic functions, churches, schools and other public venues. Smaller "outreach" groups from the Jericho membership also perform at nursing homes, school assemblies, churches and libraries.

The band consists of 28 members. Instrumentation includes: cornets, flu-gelhorn, tenor horns, baritone horns, trombones, euphoniums, tubas and percussion.

In addition to the traditional brass band literature, Jericho Brass performs marches, orchestral transcriptions, popular tunes, hymns and sacred selections, as well as patriotic favorites. An extensive music library allows Jericho Brass to tailor programs to fit all audiences.

The band has performed all across the South, including concerts in Memphis, Greenville, SC, Charleston, WVA, and Atlanta. Jericho Brass has also made two concert tours to England, performing in Huddersfield, Bourne-mouth, London and Dublin, Ireland.

This year Senior Neighbors is closing its doors, but the orchestra will continue under its new name, and meeting or rehearsals at Ridgedale Baptist Church.

Performances by the orchestra include seasonal concerts as well as programs for area schools, churches, and civic organizations. Programs include a wide variety of music styles – from classical to sacred to popular.



CHOICES Enrollment



LTSS includes care in a nursing home, as well as services to help you remain at home or in the community and participate in community activities. The kind and amount of care you get depends on what you need.
